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

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

A comparison between standard and electronic stethoscopes

The noisy in-flight interior of current air ambulance aircraft with an environmental sound level of around 82db make auscultation virtually impossible. Nevertheless, robust and reliable auscultation of a patient en-route is paramount for many acute deteriorations to be diagnosed, appropriate intervention to be established, and finally confirmation

of successful resolution. In this study, we objectively analyse the quality of recorded sound transmission as well as the subjective quality of auscultation. In both endpoints, a direct comparison between standard stethoscopes and electronic stethoscopes with amplification and ambient noise reduction is presented.





Bottle onboard – what's in it?

Among the equipment of a medical crew repatriating a patient, there are many devices and materials that are not allowed onboard commercial aircraft for security reasons - among them, liquid, aerosols and gels (LAGs). Such chemical agents and medical equipment are indispensable for treating patients during the flight.

Dr Felkai will review the usage and

efficiency of the most up-to-date equipment and methods, as well as which medical LAG materials can be tested by security personnel and carried onboard.
